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MTA Invites Public to May 4 Meeting on Proposed Transfer Facility and Improvements to Local Bus Service Near the West Baltimore MARC Train Station

Improvements Part of BaltimoreLink Plan to Redesign Entire Bus System in the Region

BALTIMORE, MD (April 26, 2016) – The Maryland Department of Transportation’s Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) will host an informational meeting on Wednesday, May 4, from 6-8:30 p.m. where plans will be presented for a proposed transfer facility and improvements to the bus service near the West Baltimore MARC Train Station. The meeting will be held in the lower sanctuary of Perkins Square Baptist Church located at 2500 Edmondson Avenue, Baltimore, Md. 21223.

The public is urged to attend to learn more and provide input.

The proposed new transfer facility, on the lot adjacent to the West Baltimore MARC Train station, will provide a safe and central location of bus stops for the many bus routes in the area. The transfer facility also will provide easy access for transfers between bus routes and between bus and MARC Train services.

“Our public outreach and education efforts are crucial as we strive to deliver a unified transit system that Baltimore residents expect and deserve,” said MTA Administrator/CEO Paul Comfort. “This plan to transform West Baltimore MARC Station into a transfer facility will make it much easier for people to connect to places they need and want to go. We hope everyone will come out on May 4 to get more details and let us know how this proposed new plan can better work for them.”

This proposed new transfer facility is part of BaltimoreLink, a plan to redesign the entire bus system throughout the region and accommodate transit riders with easier access to transfers.

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
