Welcome to Baltimore, Maryland!

Whether you're here for business or pleasure, for a week or just the day, you'll find Baltimore is full of unique places to visit, delicious foods to eat and wonderful memories to make.

This Visitors Ride Guide and map of downtown Baltimore will help you navigate to the area's attractions, special events, dining and entertainment destinations using Local Bus, Light Rail, Metro Subway or MARC Train (including MARC Train weekend service to Washington, DC). Take it with you and let the MTA make it easy and economical for you to get around.

TRANSIT FARES

MTA LOCAL BUSES, LIGHT RAIL AND METRO SUBWAY:

\$1.70 single trip, \$3.40 round trip, \$4.00 Go Pass Day (valid for unlimited one-day travel on Local Bus, Light Rail and Metro Subway).

ELIGIBILITY FOR SENIOR/DISABILITY REDUCED FARES:

Seniors (age 65+) and Individuals with Disabilities: \$.70 single trip, \$1.40 round trip, \$2.00 Go Pass Day

Senior citizens (age 65+), individuals with disabilities, and Medicare cardholders must show ONE of the following to be eligible for reduced fares on MTA transit services:

- A valid MTA Senior/Disability photo ID card,
- Any valid government-issued photo ID card with proof of age,
- A valid disability ID from another transit agency and valid government-issued photo ID, OR
- A Medicare card and any valid government-issued photo ID.

MARC TRAIN:

Fares range from \$5.00 to \$17.00 one-way. From Baltimore you can reach Washington, DC for only \$8.00. There are special reduced fares for seniors and individuals with disabilities, who meet eligibility requirements (\$2.50-\$8.50 one-way).

Up to two children under age six may ride free with each person paying full fare. Call 1-800-325-RAIL for schedule and fare information. You also can refer to a MARC Train timetable available at MARC Train stations or visit mta.maryland.gov.

METRO SUBWAY

HOURS OF OPERATION

Monday-Friday: 5 a.m. to midnight
Saturday, Sunday, and Holidays: 6 a.m. to midnight

FREQUENCY:

8 to 15 minutes (peak/off-peak)
11 minutes (weekday evenings)
15 minutes (Saturdays, Sundays, Holidays)

STATIONS:

14 stations from Owings Mills (Baltimore County) to Johns Hopkins Hospital (Baltimore City)

HOW TO RIDE METRO SUBWAY:

- Purchase ticket before boarding;
- Pass through the fare gate and get onboard;
- Smoking, eating, drinking, audio devices without earbuds and loud or profane language are not allowed onboard;
- Listen for the operator stop announcements;
- Exit when the doors open; and
- Take all your belongings with you.

Note: Metro Subway is completely accessible with escalators and elevators at all stations.

LIGHT RAIL

HOURS OF OPERATION:

Monday-Friday: 5 a.m. to midnight
Saturday: 6 a.m. to midnight
Sunday/Holidays: 11 a.m. to 7 p.m.

FREQUENCY:

20 to 30 minutes peak/off-peak (more frequent service where lines overlap.) Track exact arrival times at MyMTATracker.com

STATIONS:

33 stops from Hunt Valley (Baltimore County) to Penn Station (Baltimore City) to Glen Burnie and BWI Marshall Airport (Anne Arundel County).

HOW TO RIDE LIGHT RAIL:

- Purchase a ticket before boarding;
- Press the button on the outside of the train to gain entry;
- Smoking, eating, drinking, audio devices without earbuds and loud or profane language are not allowed onboard;
- Listen for the operator stop announcements;
- Press the green button next to the door; and
- Take all your belongings with you.

Note: Light Rail is completely accessible with elevated boarding platforms for customers not able to use train steps. Ticket vending machines feature audio, Braille and raised letter instructions.

LOCAL BUS

The MTA operates Local Bus routes throughout the Baltimore area. Many bus lines connect with major hotels in the metropolitan area. For individual bus routes and schedule information, call the MTA Transit Information Line at 410-539-5000 or 1-866-RIDE-MTA (743-3682) or visit mta.maryland.gov.


HOW TO RIDE THE LOCAL BUS:

- Pay the fare as you board. (EXACT FARE IS REQUIRED);
- Smoking, eating, drinking, audio devices without earbuds and loud or profane language are not allowed onboard;
- Listen for operator stop announcements;
- Press the yellow strip to alert the operator that you want to exit;
- Exit through the back door when possible; and
- Take all your belongings with you.

Note: All buses are lift or ramp-equipped; many have kneeling capabilities. All buses offer priority seating for seniors and individuals with disabilities, and most buses have audio and visual stop announcements.

MARC TRAIN

MARC Train Service is the most convenient and affordable way to travel between Baltimore and Washington, DC. Weekday trains leave Amtrak's Penn Station-Baltimore and downtown Baltimore's Camden Station for Union Station-Washington, DC. The fare from Penn Station-Baltimore or Camden Station to Union Station-Washington, DC is only \$8.00 one-way.

RIDE MARC TRAIN WEEKEND SERVICE BETWEEN BALTIMORE AND DC!

Hop aboard MARC Weekend Service on the Penn Line and enjoy the attractions of two of America's great cities, Baltimore and Washington, DC. One-way fare between Baltimore and DC is only \$8.00. For more information call 1-800-325-RAIL (7245) or visit mta.maryland.gov.

MARC TRAIN LINES:

PENN LINE: Perryville, MD (Cecil County) to Baltimore and Washington, DC

CAMDEN LINE: Downtown Baltimore to Washington, DC

BRUNSWICK LINE: Martinsburg, WV, and Frederick, MD to Washington, DC

- HOW TO RIDE MARC TRAIN:**
- Purchase a ticket before boarding or from the conductor onboard for an additional \$5.00 fee if the station ticket office or ticket machine was open at boarding time;
 - Smoking (including electronic cigarettes), using audio devices without earbuds and loud or profane language are not allowed;
 - Listen for the conductor's station announcements;
 - Exit when the doors open; and
 - Take all your belongings with you.
