As part of the ongoing improvements to the Howard Street corridor, the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) will be removing old bus shelters and installing new bus shelters. The following locations will be affected by the removal and installation of the shelters:

On Baltimore Street between Howard Street and Hopkins Place

- 1 New Single Shelter

On Howard Street between Baltimore Street and Fayette Street

- Demolition of Existing Shelter
- 1 New Double Shelter

On Howard Street between Fayette Street and Lexington Street

- Demolition of 2 Existing Shelters
- 2 New Double Shelters

On Howard Street between Saratoga Street and Mulberry Street

- Demolition of Existing Shelter
- 1 New Double Shelter

On Howard Street between Franklin Street and Centre Street

- Demolition of Existing Shelter
- 1 New Double Shelter with refurbished art panel

On Howard Street between Monument Street and Madison Street

- Demolition of Existing Shelter
- 1 New Single Shelter with refurbished art panel

On Howard Street at Martin Luther King Blvd.

- Demolition of 2 Existing Shelters
- 1 New Single Shelter

All MTA bus stops and Light Rail stops will remain open during this project. Your patience is appreciated. Every effort will be made to keep disruptions to a minimum. The work will involve noise and may involve night work.
