Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) Notice of Public Hearings

The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) gives notice of 3 public hearings proposing changes to the ICC Commuter Bus routes. The MTA is proposing to reallocate transit resources to areas of higher bus demand. As part of this reallocation, the MTA proposes the elimination of three commuter bus routes: Nos. 202, 203, and 205.

- **Route No. 202** operates weekday peak service between Gaithersburg and DOD/Fort Meade.
- **Route No. 203** operates weekday peak service between Columbia and Bethesda.
- **Route No. 205** operates weekday peak service between College Park and Germantown.

These bus routes have fallen short of ridership and cost recovery goals. The proposed date to discontinue service is August 1, 2013.
